Estudiantes de SeBAH-CoB empiezan el primer curso Hermano: Evangelio de Mateo

El Día del Trabajo era un día apropiado para comenzar la primera clase de SeBAH-CoB largamente esperada, impartida por un profesor Hermano. Después de años de trabajo de parto productivo en las clases impartidas por excelentes profesores menonitas, dieciséis estudiantes del grupo Alfa de tres distritos ahora tienen la oportunidad de participar en la clase Evangelio de Mateo impartida por el profesor, Dan Ulrich del Seminario Betania. La clase también proporciona a los y las estudiantes su primera experiencia en el uso de la plataforma de aprendizaje, Moodle. A través de este medio de la tecnología en lo que el profesor Dan especializa, los y las estudiantes no sólo pueden acceder a las presentaciones semanales en línea pero también pueden interactuar unos con otros por medio de las requeridas publicadas respuestas al material que están estudiando.

Otra característica importante de la clase es una contextualización rica que desafía a los y las estudiantes a compartir una descripción inicial de su entorno ministerial y luego predicar o enseñar dos veces en sus congregaciones, centrándose en las escrituras del Evangelio de Mateo. Una clase de introducción de un día se llevará a cabo este mes en los distritos ANE y PSWD donde Dan introducirá el uso de Moodle y aclarará las expectativas de la clase. *Cuidar como Jesús*, el libro en coautoría con Janice Fairchild, acaba de ser traducido y publicado por la Academia para el uso de la clase.

Es una bendición para disfrutar de los frutos de su amplio estudio del Evangelio de Mateo, así como su experiencia en la tecnología en línea. Confiamos en que el Espíritu de Dios bendecirá ricamente esta oportunidad, largamente esperada por los y las estudiantes de SeBAH-COB.

Las y los cinco estudiantes de la cohorte Beta están terminando la clase La comprensión de la Biblia, impartida por Patricia Urueña, una nueva miembro Menonita de la facultad de SeBAH quien vive en el oeste de Columbia. Ella también enseñará la próxima clase, "Teoría y Práctica del Liderazgo Pastoral" que comenzará a finales de septiembre.

Además, algunos materiales están actualmente siendo traducidos para un próximo curso La Política y las Prácticas Éticas de la Iglesia de los Hermanos, que será impartido por Rebecca Baile-Crouse durante 2017.

Un entrenamiento en Límites Saludables en español, dirigido por Ramón L. Torres de Reading, Pensilvania, se ofrecerá a ministros licenciados y ordenados interesados a través del uso de la tecnología de webcast el 22 de octubre, 2016.

SeBAH-CoB Students Gather for First CoB Class: Gospel of Matthew

Labor Day was an appropriate day to begin the long-anticipated first SeBAH-CoB class taught by a Brethren professor. After years of productive laboring in classes taught by excellent Mennonite professors, sixteen Alfa cohort students from three districts now have the opportunity to participate in the course Gospel of Matthew, taught by Bethany Seminary's Dan Ulrich, Wieand Professor of New Testament Studies. The class also provides the students their first experience using the learning platform, Moodle. Through this means of technology in which Dan specializes, students can not only access the weekly lectures online but also interact with one another by means of required posted responses to the material they are studying.

Another significant feature of Dan's class is a rich contextualization that challenges students to share an initial description of their ministry setting and then preach or teach twice in their congregations, focusing on scriptures from the Gospel of Matthew. A one-day introductory class will take place this month in the Atlantic Northeast and the Pacific Southwest Districts, in which Dan will introduce the use of Moodle and clarify class expectations. *Caring Like Jesus*, Dan's book coauthored with Janice Fairchild, has just been translated and published by the Academy for use by the class.

It is a blessing to enjoy the fruits of Dan's extensive study of Matthew's Gospel as well as his expertise in online technology. We trust that God's Spirit will richly bless this opportunity, long awaited by the SeBAH-CoB students.

Additionally, the Beta cohort of five students is finishing the class Understanding the Bible, taught by Patricia Urueña, a new Mennonite SeBAH faculty member who lives in western Columbia. She will also teach the upcoming class Theory and Practice of Pastoral Leadership beginning in late September.

Looking toward the future, materials are currently being translated for the upcoming course Church of the Brethren Polity and Ethical Practices, which will be taught by Rebecca Baile-Crouse during 2017.

Healthy Boundaries training in Spanish, led by Ramon L. Torres from Reading, Pennsylvania, is being offered to interested licensed and ordained ministers through the use of webcast technology on October 22, 2016.

Clergy Tax Seminar

The annual tax seminar for clergy will be a webcast on Saturday, January 28, 2017, from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. EST.


This seminar will cover tax law for clergy, changes for 2016 (the most current tax year to file), and detailed assistance as to how to correctly file the various forms and schedules that pertain to clergy, including housing allowances, self-employment, W-2s clergy reductions, etc.

This opportunity is highly recommended for all pastors and other church leaders who wish to understand clergy taxes, including treasurers, steward commission chairs, and church board chairs.

The seminar will be led by Deb Oskin, EA, NTPI Fellow, who has been doing clergy tax returns since 1989, when her husband became pastor of a small Church of the Brethren congregation.
