

Course Description and Objectives



Recent decades have witnessed and welcomed a “narrative turn” in theology, hermeneutics (interpretation of Biblical texts), homiletics (the art of preaching and writing sermons), biblical studies and ministry studies. This course will bring a variety of narrative theologies into conversation with literary stories and narrative theory as we study the form and function of story-shaped approaches to naming ourselves and rendering God’s name in history.

- Become familiar with a variety of genres of story theology and consider their use in contemporary pastoral and congregational ministry.
- Ponder how fictive narratives and parables function in telling the truth.
- Study and experiment with composing story-shaped theologies in the adventure of naming God, world, self and others.
