An Incarnational Education

Bethany's most vital mission is to educate people for a distinctive manner of living grounded in God's infinite love for all creation. In the fourteenth chapter of John's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that he will be going away from them, but after he is gone they will do the works that he does and even greater works than these.

"Why, and how can this be?" they wonder.

"Because," Jesus says, "the Counselor, the Spirit of Truth, dwells with you and will be in you."

In the fall of 2009, Bethany's board of trustees adopted a new mission statement:

Bethany Theological Seminary equips spiritual and intellectual leaders with an Incarnational education for ministering, proclaiming, and living out God's shalom and Christ's peace in the church and the world."

An *Incarnational education* arises from spiritual and intellectual "soil" that takes seriously

- ✤ the Genesis story that life is holy and animated by the Creator's Spirit and that human begins, bearing the image of God, are created for relationship with God, the earth, and one another;
- ✤ Jesus Christ, as the Incarnation of God's reconciling love, whose teaching ministry, death, and resurrection invite us to become people who incarnate God's compassion and hospitality;
- ✤ the continuing revelation of God's love through the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit within individuals, religious communities, villages and cities that seek to embody Christ's way of love and peace, not for themselves or their own groups alone but for all creation.

As we practice this distinctive manner of living, we experience God's shalom and Christ's peace, reconciled with God and reaching out in reconciliation to others amidst our diversity.



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Highlights of 2009-10 — Bethany's 105th year

- Forty-five new students comprised the largest incoming class in more than a decade.
- The faculty was fully staffed with the hiring of Dr. Steven Schweitzer as academic dean and Malinda Berry as instructor in theological studies.
- The board of trustees adopted a new mission statement in October 2009 and approved a new strategic plan in March 2010.
- A new financial aid plan was approved and will be implemented in 2010-11.
- The third annual Presidential Forum, "When Strangers Are Angels," was attended by a capacity crowd. Distinguished theologian and writer Dr. Martin Marty was the keynote speaker.
- Brethren nationwide gathered at Bethany in May for the church planting conference "Plant Generously, Reap Bountifully."
