A snapshot of Bethany engaging the world –

- ◆ Scott Holland, Slabaugh Professor of Theology and Culture and director of peace studies and cross-cultural studies, is teaching a course titled Just Peace, in which students explore the movement inspired by the World Council of Churches to integrate peace into every part of life. This class feeds into the upcoming Presidential Forum weekend about the same topic, inviting the larger community into the conversation to see peacemaking as a pilgrimage that we share with one another.
- ◆ Courtney Hess, Lilly Grant project director, continues to tackle questions of debt and financial literacy in the seminary context. One way of doing this is by using a variety of faith-based financial literacy courses. Hess encourages students to make solid financial plans for futures in ministry while integrating stewardship into the fabric of their financial decisions.

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Highlights of 2014-15 — Bethany's 110th Year

- ◆ Eighteen new Bethany alumni/ae received degrees in May.
- ◆ Bethany was named to the 2015 class of Seminaries that Change the World by the Center for Faith and Service at McCormick Theological Seminary.
- ◆ Dr. Nate Inglis, a member of Olympic View Church of the Brethren, was hired as assistant professor of theological studies and began July 1, 2015.
- ◆ Our faculty presented more than 160 sermons, workshops, and other group presentations. As professionals in their fields, they also participated in national and international guilds and conferences, speaking in Jamaica, London, South Africa, and Vienna.
- ◆ The Institute for Ministry with Young and Young Adults hosted more than sixty-five people at the first Young Adult Forum—Anabaptism, the Next Generation.
- ◆ We celebrated the success of the Reimagining Ministries campaign with a total of \$6.6 million raised, surpassing the original goal by 12 percent.
- ◆ The Bethany Neighborhood, reduced-cost community housing for students, was dedicated, including the naming of Patterson House for longtime Bethany supporters Ivan and Clara Patterson.
