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TRIM CLASS

Now the Silence, Now the Songs: The Body of Christ at Worship



Lani Wright led this eight-week online course from February 2 to March 27. This was a popular Ministry Skills class with nineteen TRIM, EFSM, and continuing education students participating. They explored the theology and structure of worship as expressed in the free church tradition.

The textbooks used were *Worship for the Whole People of God: Vital Worship for the 21st Century* by Ruth C. Duck and *Beyond the Worship Wars* by Thomas G. Long.

Narrative Theology



On the weekend of April 16-19, seven students from across the country gathered at McPherson College (Western Plains District) to participate in the Narrative Theology course taught by Scott Holland.

"The great Jewish writer Elie Wiesel suggests that God made humanity because God loves stories. Our souls and society are wonderfully story shaped. In our Narrative Theology class, we pondered together how stories save us as we invited the stories of God to enter our own narratives, confessions, and conversations. Narrative theologians remind us that "we tell a story to find another story." As we studied texts and considered the living texts of our lives, we enjoyed learning new stories about God, world, self, and others."

The textbooks used were *Uncovering Spiritual Narratives: Using Story in Pastoral Care and Ministry* by Suzanne M. Coyle, *Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi* by Amy-Jill Levine, and *Holy the Firm* by Annie Dillard.

Education for a Shared Ministry Kickoff Weekend Uses Technology

An EFSM Kickoff Weekend took place March 27-29 with Peace Community Church of the Brethren in Windsor, Colorado (Western Plains District). The ministers-in-training, supervising pastor, district liaison and Congregational Training Group met onsite, but due to health issues, Julie Hostetter could not lead the sessions in person. Conversations, group training processes, and worship took place using appropriate technology.

On Friday evening Ken Frantz, the supervising pastor from Huxton Church of the Brethren; Sonja Griffith, the district executive who is serving as the district liaison; and Julie met via conference call to explore the ministry training program using the EFSM notebook. They also reviewed the proposed formats for Saturday and Sunday.

On Saturday these three joined Jodi and Steve Bell, the ministers-in-training, and the other members of the Congregational Training Group: Bonnie Barrett, Bill Collins, Donna and Larry Elliot, Brenda and Jay MacDonald-Buttrum, and Eunice Zieler. The group met via Skype and participated in worship, community building, and discussion of components of EFSM. By the end of the day, they had organized a tentative outline and timeline for the next few years focused on their upcoming learning units.

Again using Skype, the Sunday morning worship included music led by Jodi and Steve, a dialog scripture reading by two of the congregation's youth, and a sermon offered by Jodi. The worship concluded with an introduction to EFSM for the entire congregation and a commissioning service for those present led by Julie. It was a wonderful teaching-learning-worshipping experience that illustrated how technology can be used to "equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ." (Eph 4:12)

Spanish-Language Ministry Training Programs

New SeBAH Cohort Launch Postponed until Fall 2015 – Four districts have expressed interest in having students participate in a new SeBAH-CoB cohort. Participants who complete this ministry training program will fulfill the educational requirements for ordination. Names of prospective students are still being proposed, followed by district interviews before they are accepted into the program. The orientation event will be led by Rafael Barahona, director of Hispanic Pastoral and Leadership Education for the Mennonite Education Agency, and will take place at Camp Swatara (Bethel, Pennsylvania) October 9-11, 2015. Joel Peña, the Atlantic Northeast District SeBAH-CoB coordinator and the new coordinator of Spanish-language ministry training programs for the Brethren Academy will join Rafael and the new students at the camp. We are excited to see new interest and to welcome new students into this important opportunity for ministry training.

New Staff Position Posted - The Brethren Academy for Ministerial Leadership announced a quarter-time position opening: coordinator of Spanish-language ministry training programs for the Church of the Brethren. The primary functions of the position are to administer the Seminario Biblico Anabautista Hispano (SeBAH-CoB) educational program, design and administer the new Spanish-language track of the Education for a Shared Ministry educational program, and work with various constituencies to provide leadership for Spanish-language ministry training programs. CONTINUING EDUCATION EVENTS

Supervision in Ministry Class Held in ANE District

The fourth Supervision in Ministry class was held during March and April 2015 using both Bethany Seminary's technology classroom and face-to-face time in Pennsylvania. The first 1.5 hours of instruction took place on March 26 using Adobe Connect, a multiframe video conference option. Each participant and the instructor were visible and audible to the others. The technology was useful for introductions, presentations, and class discussion.

The second part of the course took place on April 17 and 18 at the Atlantic Northeast District Office in Elizabethtown, Pennsylvania. Each participant and the instructor prepared a ministry reflection report (an account of an experience in ministry). After the modeling of the process by the instructor and one class member, each person presented his/her report and was supervised by another participant. The remainder of the group served as process observers. After each supervisory conversation, the entire group debriefed the experience. This model of supervision is based on the book *Transforming the Rough Places: The Ministry of Supervision* by Kenneth Pohly.

The combination of online and onsite learning allowed participants to attend the first part of the class without having to travel to the Brethren Academy in Richmond, Indiana. It also meant that the instructor could travel to the region where the participants were located for the all-important in-person conversations. As is often the case, this class proved to be a rich experience in the practice of the ministry of supervision.


