August 2018 – Those involved with the Brethren Academy for Ministerial Leadership as orientation is held for incoming Academy students


September 2018 – New and returning students as we begin our 114th academic year

The new Pillars and Pathways Residency Scholarship will enable students to complete seminary with no additional educational or consumer debt. It covers the gap between the expected cost of attendance for residential students and the

combination of Bethany financial aid and the amount students earn per year. Recipients also put learning into practice by serving both the Bethany and Richmond communities and living within their means.



Bethany and Ekklesiyar Yan'uwa a Nigeria (EYN) have entered into an historic relationship: a mutual commitment to a new intercontinental online education program that will facilitate theological study at Bethany for EYN members. Faculty and students in Nigeria will gather at a new technology center where they will share the classroom with students and faculty at Bethany in real time. The first course is scheduled for January 2018.

Extending Our Witness Enlarging Our Impact


Bethany faculty are known as experts in their fields. They regularly participate in national and international guilds and conferences, speaking in locations such as London, South Africa, Canada, Vienna, Jamaica, Wittenberg, Beirut, and Nairobi. Recent new courses that reflect today's church and society include Ministry across Generations, Restorative Justice, Brethren and Society, Science Fiction and Theology, Ecotheology and Christian Responsibility, Just Peace: An Ecumenical Call, Gender and Christian Devotion, and The Theological Imagination.

Looking to the future, **Bethany Theological Seminary** has developed a new vision with themes of growth, innovation and diversity.

A hallmark of Bethany's education will be an interdisciplinary approach to learning that integrates and synthesizes theory and practice, thereby enlarging the impact of its increasingly diverse programs of study.



Academics at Bethany are flexible, enabling students to craft their own educational paths. MDiv students can choose from seven ministry foci, and all degree students can choose from twelve emphases. And, in 2016 the Seminary launched specialized graduate certificates: Intercultural Biblical Interpretation, Conflict Transformation, and Theopoetics and Theological Imagination. All are great continuing education opportunities for pastors, with a generous financial aid arrangement.



Following a tradition of engaging in partnerships—notably, the current arrangement with Earlham School of Religion—Bethany is working with the nonprofit City of Refuge in Atlanta, Georgia, to offer a course in urban ministry next January. Staff with the organization will coordinate the students' onsite involvement in its programs, allowing them to apply theological study in real-life settings. It is the latest in partnerships that Bethany hopes to continue forming.
