Upcoming Course Highlights

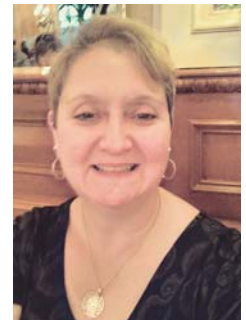

Set-Apart Ministry in the Bivocational Reality

Bivocational ministry is a reality in many denominations. It is not only a calling but a necessity; part-time ministry placements often outnumber full-time placements. Stephen Norcross writes, "A part-time arrangement between pastor and congregation does not mean that the person is a part-time pastor, nor that the congregation is a part-time church." This class will explore the set-apart ministry within the bivocational context, including the rewards and challenges for both pastor and congregation. Topics include the bivocational ministry of the Apostle Paul and an investigation of 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy, and Titus.
