Course Description and Objectives



This course provides a brief overview of the history of Christianity from the Reformation to World War II. Topics of study include the Magisterial Reformation, the Radical Reformation, Roman Catholic reform, Protestant Orthodoxy, Pietism and the Evangelical Awakening, the impact of Enlightenment rationalism, missionary expansion, Protestant liberalism and fundamentalism, the ecumenical movement, and Christianity in developing countries.

Students will:

1. attempt to understand key Christian thinkers and their ideas in relationship to Christian ritual and practice as well as to non-Christian religions, philosophy, and natural science,
2. familiarize themselves with some of the major issues, events, and personalities in Christian history,
3. become aware of the problems and methods of the academic disciplines of church history, intellectual history, and theology.

After three decades teaching in the Religion and Philosophy Department of Manchester University, he joined the Bethany faculty in 2008. He taught a seminar for Marburg University in the fall semester 2017. He has been an ordained minister in the Church of the Brethren for more than thirty years.

Expectations

Online learning requires students to be disciplined in their time management. Students are expected to spend 10 hours per week in course-related work.

For online learning, students will need basic computer skills and access to the internet. If your computer is four years old or less, you should have the capabilities for this class. These capabilities include:

- Modem: Minimum 56 kbps speed is slow but adequate. A speed of 100 kbps (300 recommended) is needed for podcasts and 300 kbps (500 recommended) for videos
