Course Description and Objectives

How has the Brethren movement developed over time? How have Brethren confronted issues in the broader society, such as slavery, war, or prohibition? This course will answer these questions and others by exploring the history of the Brethren movement, beginning with its origins in Schwarzenau, Germany and tracing its development through over 300 years of history. While this course will predominantly focus on the Church of the Brethren, the class will also touch briefly on other Brethren groups. The course will investigate the social historical contexts in which the Brethren emerged in Europe, immigrated to North America, and spread to other countries. A focus of the course will be on the changes and continuities among the Brethren in interaction with surrounding cultures.

- Students will learn the names of and some significant stories about important women and men who have shaped the history of the Brethren as well as learn some of the social historical conditions in which they lived and worked. Students will be able to identify at least four significant Brethren leaders.
- Students will be able to analyze one contributing cause to divisions occurring among the Brethren in 1880s.
- Students will learn about factors in the growth, decline, and spread of the Brethren in North America as well as Brethren interaction with important events in U.S. history.

Instructor: Denise Kettering-Lane

Denise Kettering-Lane is the Associate Professor of Brethren Studies at Bethany Theological Seminary. She earned an MTS from Candler School of Theology and then completed her PhD at The University of Iowa in 2009. She began teaching at Bethany in 2010. Before coming to Bethany, Denise worked as an archival assistant at the Brethren Historical Library and Archives in Elgin, Illinois. She teaches courses on Brethren history and theology as well as general courses in church history. She also serves as the editor for the journal *Brethren Life and Thought*.

Denise and her husband Calvin have 2 children and currently live near Dayton, Ohio.
