## Identifying other continuing education opportunities:

- Contact your Church of the Brethren district office to learn what is being offered.
- If your district has an Academy Certified Training System (ACTS), find out if they offer courses for continuing education or personal enrichment.
- Check the websites of local colleges, universities, or seminaries to learn what is available for community members.
- Consult your local ministerium for events or programs in your area.
- Contact your local hospital and ask about educational events.
- Sabbaticals can afford clergy concentrated time to focus on renewal and continuing education.
