Spotlight On Upcoming Courses

Defining Set-Apart Ministry within the Multivocational Reality
September 6 – October 31, 2023
Instructor: Sandra Jenkins
Online, 8-weeks

This course will explore the set-apart ministry within the multivocational context, including the rewards and challenges for both pastor and congregation. Instructor and multivocational minister Sandra Jenkins will teach this course. Topics include the multivocational ministry of the Apostle Paul and an investigation of 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy, and Titus. Students in this course will also learn how time management, leader motivation, and an understanding of mission are all important skills for multivocational ministry.

Introduction to Hebrew Scriptures October 11 – December 5, 2023 Instructor: Matt Boersma Online, 8-weeks

While the Church of the Brethren has long held the New Testament as its focus, the Old Testament or Hebrew Bible is the basis of much of the New Testament's faith. This course, taught by Hebrew scholar Matt Boersma, will work through the various books of the Hebrew Bible and look at their ancient context, their influence on the New Testament, and modern theories about these texts.

TRIM Updates

The Summons: Ministry Training and Discipleship

There is a great hymn, written by Scottish minister and musician John Bell, called *The Summons*. This hymn is written in the voice of God, summoning someone to heed the call to follow and never be the same. The first stanza goes like this:

Will you come and follow me
If I but call your name?
Will you go where you don't know
And never be the same?
Will you let my love be shown,
Will you let my name be known,
Will you let my life be grown
In you and you in me?

This hymn echoes the calling of the first disciples of Jesus. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus calls Peter, Andrew, James, and John to follow him so that he can teach them to be "fishers of people." The narrator tells us that upon hearing the call of Jesus, they <u>immediately</u> leave their nets and their boats to follow him (Matt 4:18-22). For the next few years, Jesus taught and trained them, alongside the other disciples, to be faithful followers and leaders. Their lives were forever changed when they answered the summons, and they would go on to change the lives of many in Jesus's name.

Those who heed the summons of Christ to enter a season of learning and training through the TRIM and EFSM programs will explore these themes together at the annual summer orientation. New students and their coordinators/supervisors leave behind their own versions of nets and boats at orientation in order to begin the journey of learning and training, together. And in doing so, they form a cohort of disciples who will go on the journey together, learning and training to "fish for people" in Jesus's name. This year, orientation will be held at Bethany Theological Seminary from August 8-10, 2023.

If you know someone in your district or you yourself are hearing the summons, be in touch with your district ministry commission and/or the Brethren Academy for Ministerial Leadership to explore ministry training options. Drop your net, tie up your boat, and take the first step, today!



Clergy Find Strength for the Journey

Strength for the Journey (SFTJ) is a continuing education opportunity provided by the Brethren Academy for Ministerial Leadership. The program provides support to groups of ministers to help them meet and discuss topics of mutual interest and gather for worship and prayer. Four groups or "cohorts" formed in January 2023. Each of these cohorts, which meet via Zoom, is led by a skilled convener who helps to guide the conversation. (An earlier, in-person cohort of clergywomen will conclude three years together this July.)

Each of the 2023 cohorts has a unique focus. One cohort of chaplains is gathering around the unique challenges of serving in long-term care or hospice facilities. A second cohort is focused on interim ministry. Another is made up of pastors whose attention is on pastoral care. And the fourth consists of women who serve as District Executive/Ministers. The goal of SFTJ is to provide support and foster growth for all who minister in the Church of the Brethren.



Supporting each cohort is a skilled convener who manages resources, coordinates logistics, and, most importantly, holds safe and sacred space for their cohort. The 2023 SFTJ Conveners bring a wealth of skills and ministry experience. They are Connie Burkholder (McPherson, KS), Martha Beahm (Columbia, SC), Christy Dowdy (Rockingham, VA), and John Fillmore (Caldwell, ID). Dave Kerkove (Waterloo, IA) serves as an alternate. The cohorts, along with their conveners, will meet 10 to of 12 times over the year.

New cohorts will form for 2024, with new topics.
