New Course Spotlight

Ministering Across Cultures: Building Bridges Through Intercultural Competence

Onsite at Bethany Theological Seminary

This course isn't technically new to the Brethren Academy, but it has been a long time since it was offered. We are excited for Darla Kay Deardorff to teach an updated intercultural course entitled Ministering Across Cultures: Building Bridges Through Intercultural Competence. Darla is the UNESCO Chair on Intercultural Competence at Stellenbosch University in South Africa, as well as the Founding President of the global nonprofit World Council on Intercultural and Global Competence. She is also a Research Scholar at Duke University and holds faculty appointments at universities in South Africa, China, Japan, and Canada.

Rooted in the multicultural vision of Revelation 7:9, this course will equip church leaders with the skills, knowledge, and insight needed to engage with and minister to diverse neighbors. In addition to these practical skills, students will explore how cultural values, beliefs, and practices shape experiences and interactions and develop an awareness of one's cultural lens while learning to recognize the lens of others.

This course is open to anyone who desires to better connect with the diverse community around them. This course is an intensive, taking place on the campus of Bethany Theological Seminary, March 17-19, 2025. The Brethren Academy is providing a travel stipend of up to \$300 for 8 pastors or church leaders who register for this course. The stipend is to offset the travel costs to get to Bethany Theological Seminary. Reimbursement will be made upon submission of travel receipts.

Spotlight on Upcoming Course: Effective Leadership for Times Such as These

This course will focus on transformational and servant leadership. When the Body of Christ is struggling for effective life and mission in a world needing Good News, it calls for creative thinking that is outside the box of the usual. Change is difficult for any system and requires special insights and skills to prepare an organization for another way of living and practicing mission. The leader must be transformed as well as the church system.



Randy Yoder has served as a pastor, District Executive in Middle PA, and church coach. He also has served on the General Board (prior to it being known as the Ministry and Mission Board) and was an independent staff person for Brethren Benefit Trust as a specialist in long-term care insurance. He has served as Interim District Executive for Atlantic Northeast and Western Plains Districts, and Interim Pastor at Oakton Church of the Brethren in Mid-Atlantic District. He has taught classes for TRIM and seminarylevel students in the areas of leadership and polity and practice. He earned a D.Min. from McCormick Seminary in the area of not-forprofit organization and development.

- 1.Clarification about leadership and congregational transformation from a movement perspective and why each is important.
- 2.Gaining insights about servant and transformational leadership styles that speak to effectiveness for this time.
- 3.Gaining a renewed commitment and important insights to make Christ the focus and the body of Christ the emphasis for practicing vital and effective mission in the neighborhoods of our unique congregations.
- 4.Addressing why pietism and anabaptism practices are relevant to growing the Kingdom of God with today's generational challenges.
- 5.Learning three key elements of an effective body of Christ.
- Expand and practice learned understandings of how to read a congregation's life-cycle.
- 7. Developing learning skills to be Christ in the neighborhood.
- 8. Learning practices for reading congregational and community culture and how to work at creating a missional culture.
- Envisioning evangelism from the perspective of growing the Kingdom of God.
- 10. Learning to manage conflict that arises in a transformational process.

As a pastor's wife and later as a tax professional, she learned the tax problems and pitfalls associated with the IRS's identification of clergy as "hybrid employees." In 2011, after twelve years with H&R Block, Deb left to start her own tax practice, specializing in clergy taxes. Clergy clients now make up 90 percent of her client base. She has been teaching and presenting nationally on clergy taxation to clergy, treasurers and administrators, and tax pros since 2004. Other than the fact that she really likes to teach, Deb does this because of her deep belief that clergy can devote more of their energy to ministry if they aren't stressed by tax debt. Deb is an experienced presenter, and despite the complexity of the material, you'll find yourself laughing. Learn and enjoy!
